Context of the Role

Founded in 1858, Melbourne Grammar School educates some 1,800 students from Prep to Year 12. It aims to develop fully within its students the 'whole person': intellectually, physically, emotionally, psychologically, socially and spiritually.

The School is organised into three campuses to meet the needs of different age groups. Our Junior School, Grimwade House (Prep to Year 6) is located in Caulfield, and is coeducational with 650 girls and boys. The Middle School, Wadhurst (Years 7 and 8), and Senior School (Years 9 to 12) are in South Yarra and cater for 1,150 boys - day students and boarders.

Grimwade House is a caring and happy environment which values the particular nature of each child. The School is divided into two well-resourced sections, each with its own classrooms, level coordinator and specially designed play area. 'Harleston' houses the Junior Primary Years Prep, 1, 2. and 3 and Upper Primary for Years 4, 5 and 6. In addition to an extensive classroom program there are a number of specialist programs that work together to provide a holistic educational experience.

Purpose of the Role

The role of the Primary Classroom Teacher is to facilitate and support student learning across all domains. This includes the social, emotional, academic, physical and spiritual development, with the goal to maximise the individual growth of students in a challenging and supportive environment.

Key Responsibilities

The following responsibilities are not exhaustive, nor necessarily in order of priority, but are indicative of the range and nature of the role.

Teaching

- Ensure that the caring, supportive and vibrant environment in which the children grow and learn is maintained and further developed.
- Develop and maintain relationships and open communication with parents, colleagues and students.
- Prepare and teach a comprehensive curriculum for the year level allocated.
- Assist with curriculum development in collaboration with colleagues.
- Utilise appropriate conditions for learning.
- Assess and differentiate learning for the needs of individual students.
- Deliver the curriculum using a technology-rich, integrated, inquiry-based approach.
- Maintain thorough records for each child, including assessment data and meetings.
- Write comprehensive student reports at the end of each semester.
- Be involved regularly in professional development activities to ensure teaching expertise is at the leading edge of developments in education.
- Participate actively in all aspects of school life beyond the classroom including sport, outdoor education and/or cultural activities.
- Actively support the directions, goals and values of the School.
- Participate and contribute to meetings, as required.
- Perform other duties as appropriate to the position and assigned by key members of staff.



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Key Selection Criteria

Required

- Demonstrated experience in teaching primary school students from Prep to Year 6
- University degree in Teaching
- Demonstrated ability to build positive rapport with students and staff, exercising professional boundaries
- Ability to create a safe environment that fosters trust and respect
- Outstanding communication/interpersonal skills
- Well-developed time management, administrative and organisational skills
- Flexibility and adaptability to respond to differing learning needs and strengths of students
- Commitment to, and understanding of, the values and ethos of Melbourne Grammar School
- Ability to develop a dynamic and inspiring learning environment which supports student excellence
- Relevant teaching qualification and Current Victorian Institute of Teaching (VIT) registration or ability to obtain VIT
- A commitment to contributing to the co-curricular life of the school.

Desirable

- Design and implement effective teaching strategies that are responsive to the local community and cultural setting, linguistic background and histories of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students
- Provide opportunities for students to develop understanding of and respect for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories, cultures and languages
- Strong ability to utilise Information Communication Technology as a vital part of the learning process
- Flexibility and adaptability to meeting the particular needs of individual students within a range of situations
- Knowledge of the *Disability Act, 2006 (Vic)* and its implications for schools, students and the role of a Teacher.

Commitment to Child Safety
